at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln! The Husker Hockey Team has been a pioneer in Midwest collegiate hockey since 1972. We began competing as an independent team in the American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) in 2005, and in 2009, we joined the North Central Collegiate Hockey Association (NCCCHA), a league within the ACHA.

Players enter our program with a variety of hockey backgrounds and experiences, ranging from high school to junior league competition. All players have the opportunity to make the team, and when numbers support it, it will be possible for us to field two teams (with the second team playing an independent schedule).

Practices begin when school starts in the fall and the season potentially goes into March, depending on post-season tournament eligibility. We try to schedule about 25 regular season games, with no games scheduled over the Thanksgiving and semester breaks.

If you are a full-time student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, you are eligible to become a member of the Husker Hockey team.
